## Research Travel Award

Recognizing the significant material and financial challenges inherent in multi-sited studies, FEEGI awards an annual research grant of \$1000 to support travel to archival or other field sites. This award is open to all FEEGI members but is intended especially for graduate students, independent scholars, and untenured faculty.

To apply please submit the following materials by **November 1, 2022**:

- 1) A short CV (two pages maximum).
- 2) A 500-750 word project description, including importance of the project; work plan with timetable; nature of research to be conducted; venues to be visited; and intended results of the research.
- 3) A budget which includes a detailed explanation of how you will spend the funds.
