- Summary: In the 1910s, progressive reformers created a national girls' organization-the Camp Fire Girls-to combat what they believed to be a crisis in girls' education. Helgren traces the changing meanings of girls' citizenship in the shifting social and cultural contexts of the twentieth century, using the organization's history to explore critical intersections of gender, race, class, nation, and disability.
