In June 2015, the New Jersey Historical Commission and Rutgers University Libraries, in partnership with Monmouth University, launched a new, peer-reviewed journal that publishes the most recent scholarship and educational materials about New Jersey's history and more.

Titled *New Jersey Studies: An Interdisciplinary Journal*, it is available free of charge. The Journal is published twice annually, in the Winter and Summer. Contents include peer-reviewed articles, invited talks, featured archival documents and artifacts, teachers' guides, book, exhibit, and film reviews; and more. The journal also publishes select award-winning graduate and undergraduate student papers.
