Call for Papers for the 2023 Annual Conference

“Reckonings and Re-Imaginings: Hungary, Hungarians, and the Quest for Justice”

The Hungarian Studies Association of Canada invites proposals for individual papers, posters, roundtable discussions, workshops, complete panels, and other innovative presentations and sessions for our annual conference to be held in conjunction with the Congress of Social Sciences and Humanities hosted by York University in Toronto, Ontario, from May 30–June 1, 2023.

In harmony with the Congress theme “Reckonings and Re-Imaginings” and its target emphasis on the achievement of equity in society and environmental sustainability, this year’s HSAC conference seeks to examine any and all topics related to Hungarian studies that privilege efforts to challenge unjust conditions and social systems tending to thwart human and environmental flourishing. This topic opens the door to a wide range of topics from historical events and movements, to politics, ethical concerns, literary and artistic responses to injustice including media, film, music, etc., journalism, economic issues, the sciences, and much more. Our goal is to open the door to all constructive consideration of topics relating to Hungarian studies writ large, that promote the notion of seeking justice in an unjust world.

Proposals should include a **maximum 300-word abstract and a brief 100-word bio that can be used to introduce the speaker**. Since both the abstract and the bio will be published online, they should be prepared in Word format using Times New Roman, 12-point font. **Abstracts should be sent electronically both** to the Chair

Presentations at the conference are no longer than 20 minutes with an additional 5-10 minutes for discussion. **The deadline for submission is Wednesday, March 15th, 2023.** We will notify presenters of the Committee's decisions no later than March 30, 2023.
