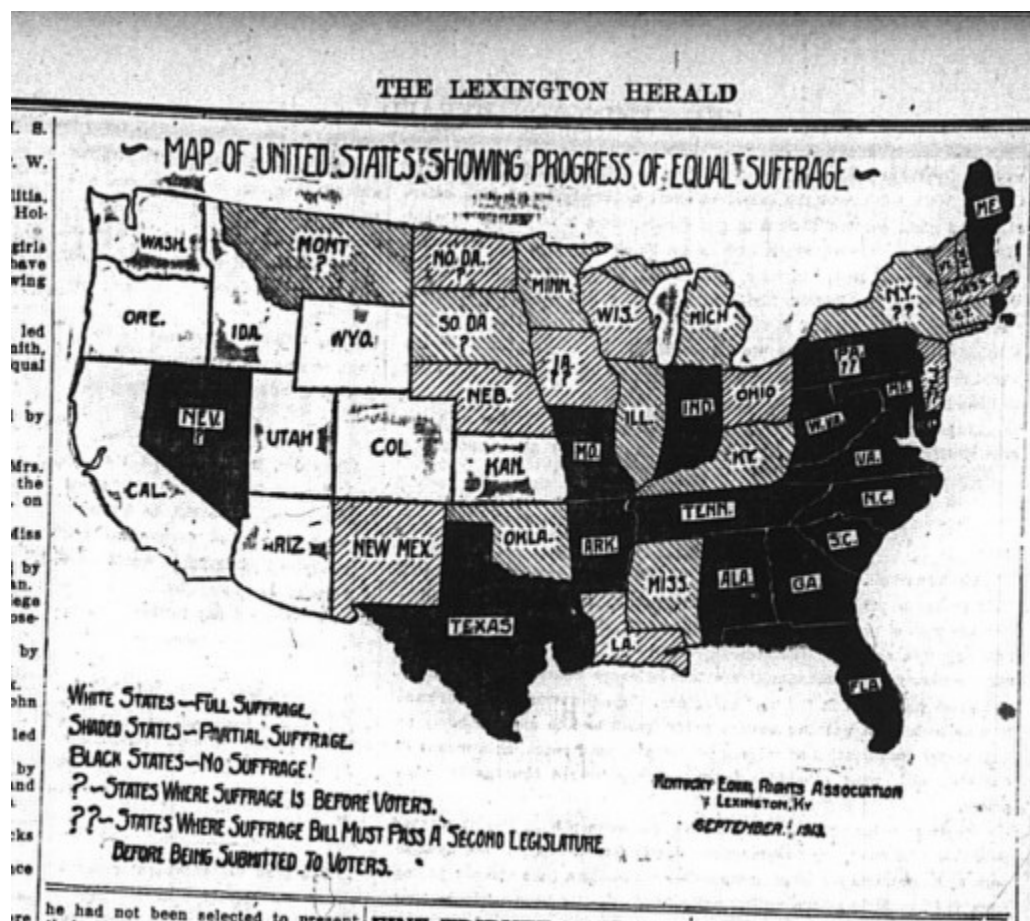

A question mark delineates where states are deliberating a suffrage bill (ratification
