On April 25 and April 26, 2019, the Africana Studies Department at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte will host its 17th Annual Symposium, "Religion, Racism, and Religious Racism: The Color of Faith Discrimination." The symposium will open on April 25 with a moderated discussion with Babalorixá Gustavo Melo Cerqueira titled "Religious Racism in Brazil: Evangelical Extremism Against African Diaspora Faiths." On April 26, the event will continue with five hour-long panels, as well as a special midday presentation by Dr. Abbas Barzegar, Director of Research and Advocacy at the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR).
