Dear H-Diplo readers,

As we begin another academic year of H-Diplo publications, we would like to thank our incredible team of editors who are responsible for our publication program and the functioning of the list. They have made H-Diplo one of the most relevant and important open-access scholarly resources on the Internet, and the flagship list for scholars of diplomatic history and international relations. Our subscriber base continues to expand (H-Diplo is one of the largest H-Net lists), and our website attracts tens of thousands of visits per month. Each year we publish close to 250 in-house publications, along with over 100 H-Diplo H-Net reviews. We regularly review articles from *Cold War History*, *Diplomatic History*, *Intelligence and National Security*, *International History Review*, *International Journal*, *International Security*, *Journal of American East Asian Studies*, *Journal of Cold War Studies*, *Journal of Transatlantic Studies*, *Journal of Strategic Studies*, and *Security Studies*.

The H-Diplo team:

1. H-Diplo In-House Publications:

Tom Maddux (CSU Northridge, Emeritus), our prolific and indispensable senior review editor, is responsible for the vast majority of our in-house publications. Simply put, he is the backbone of our publication programme.

He works with senior review editors Diane Labrosse and Seth Offenbach (Bronx Community College). Seth, who holds many other H-Diplo positions, is also a vital member of our publication project.

Cindy Ewing (University of Toronto) joined H-Diplo earlier this year as a review editor. She has commissioned an impressive range of reviews of books and articles and is a valued part of the editing team.

This year we are in the process of recruiting a new roster of review editors, and are pleased to announce that Michael C. Behrent (Appalachian State University), Jon Davidann, (University of Hawai'i,) Frank Gerits (Utrecht University), Michael E. Neagle (Nichols College), and William Whitworth (Northeastern University) have joined us. Our goal is to maintain our level of production while expanding its reach

and focus. Welcome to our new editors!

Daniel Steinmetz-Jenkins has wrapped up his review editing for H-Diplo. We wish him all the best for the future and thank him for organizing a stimulating series of discussions on many important new books.

Danny will join our team of editors-at-large, Andy DeRoche (Front Range Community College), Dustin Walcher (Southern Oregon University), and Yafeng Xia (Long Island University), who serve occasional advisory roles in our commissioning discussions.

H-Diplo's **Journal Watch** editors, Erin Black (University of Toronto), and Lubna Qureshi (Independent Scholar), provide an enormous service to the academic community. They curate and collate our quarterly JW reports that include the tables of contents of all periodicals that are germane to the fields of diplomatic history and international relations.

The **H-Diplo/ISSF project** continues to expand. Its Executive Editor is Robert Jervis, who acts as a vital intellectual bridge between the worlds of history and international relations. He, Joshua Rovner (American University), Stacie Goddard (Wellesley College), Tom Maddux, Diane Labrosse, and Seth Offenbach, oversee the commissioning of reviews for the project.

Web and Production Editing:

George Fujii, H-Diplo's Web and Production Editor, is responsible for the formatting, publication, and archiving of all of our in-house publications, including those of the H-Diplo/ISSF project. George innovated our highly readable and elegant pdf publication formatting many years ago; his work undergirds the entire publication program. As always, we rely heavily on his indispensable knowledge and expertise.

2. The H-Diplo Commons:

The H-Diplo Commons, which is supported and maintained by **H-Net**, offers a wide range of services in addition to hosting our publications.

Our **List Editors**, Seth Offenbach, Christopher Ball, (Independent Scholar), and Julie Prieto (U.S. Army Center of Military History) work hard to ensure the daily smooth functioning of the list, and are responsible for posting announcements, calls for papers, queries, and conference programmes. They also interact with subscribers who contact them with specific queries and comments, and offer help and advice to those who need it.

Every weekend Seth Offenbach publishes the many reviews that he commissions as H-Diplo's review editor for **the H-Net Reviews** project.

The **Teaching Syllabus Archive Project** allows scholars from around the world to access syllabi from a range of courses that are taught at universities and colleges. Seth Offenbach created the project, and our new editor, Andrew Szarejko, (Georgetown University) will take his place in September. We welcome Andrew to the project and hope that our readers will work with him as he enhances and expands this important resource.
