About the Fellowship

One recipient will be awarded the *Frances E. Malamy Fellowship* to perform independent scholarly research at the library within a three-month time-frame between **January 2, 2020 and December 31, 2020**. Research must include use of archival materials held at the Phillips Library, and/or archiving activities under the direction of the Phillips Library staff. Research for this fellowships will be carried out at 306 Newburyport Turnpike, Rowley, MA 01969.

The Phillips Library requests the Malamy Fellow to submit a summary of their research for the benefit of museum staff and the public. The format of this summary is negotiable. Past recipients have given presentations on their research or contributed to the museum's blog. PEM reserves the right to publicize the resulting product in order to promote research within the collection. Recipients are also requested to submit copies of any publication that results from their research to PEM.

The recipient will receive a \$5,500 award, payable in two equal installments, at the middle and conclusion of their residency. This fellowship does not include housing.
