Ideal areas of specialization included Latin American History, History of Medicine, or History of Science. Preference will be given to candidates with at least 18 graduate credits outside of History that would allow them to assist the department in teaching cross-listed courses in Criminal Justice, Public Health, or Sociology. The Faculty member promotes Marian University's Catholic mission and identity by contributing to the ongoing development of students and wide ranging programs within the Department of History and Social Sciences.
