The application process is likely to involve several stages: we encourage first-rate prospective students to develop sound and robust applications through November-December 2021. Promising applicants will be invited to an online interview.

We also welcome enquiries about self-funded or externally sponsored postgraduate research and collaborative doctoral awards.
