A Walbanga and Wadi Wadi woman, she is an award-winning designer and film producer whose career links Indigenous stories and traditional knowledge with contemporary design. In 2015 was inducted into the Design Institute of Australia's Hall of Fame.

She teaches at the School of Design, University of Technology Sydney, and is also an Honorary Fellow at Deakin University's School of Communication and Creative Arts.

Her most recent book was co-authored with the anthropologist, Paul Memmott, and was published in 2021 by Thames & Hudson Australia & New Zealand, 'Design: Building on Country'.
