Rob Hudson (Kurnai Monero Ngarigo man and Cultural Manager of the Krowathunkooloong Keeping Place), and Shannon Woodcock (white historian), "More-than-human teachers in First Nations museum spaces: Dingo and the Krowathunkooloong Keeping Place"

Dingo is a teacher in everyday life for the Gunai Kurnai Community, bringing the ethics and law of sharing resources from and with Country to the practice of family mealtimes. They also play a central role in the permanent exhibition of the Keeping Place, where Rob shares their purpose with visitors, and protects them from the colonial economy of extraction. In this short talk we will share what attention to Dingo's place in Community teaches colonists about our ways of studying and representing 'nature', 'animals', 'history', and our ways of making homes on unceded Gunai Kurnai Country.

This talk draws on our forthcoming book *Self-Determined First Nations Museums and Colonial Contestation: The Keeping Place* (Routledge, April 2022).
